COURSE OVERVIEW

This workshop is being offered in advance of the new ringing year, when directors are in preparations. Participants, with clinician Debbie Fingas, will examine the components of conducting and the means of how musical indicators and patterns contained in the score get communicated from conductor to ringers. This workshop will give participants ample individual attention.

This workshop will include:

- Teaching correct posture and stance
- Teaching correct baton technique
- Learning how to mark the score and identify the score elements through score study
- Conducting music beginning on different beats
- Conducting patterns of 4/4, 3/4, 2/2, 3/2 and simple mixed metres 2/4, 3/4 and 4/4
- Indicating and conducting tempo changes
- Conducting a clear preparatory beat and clear cut-offs
- Indicating and maintaining a steady pulse
- Conducting dynamic changes with the use of the conducting hand, and the nonconducting hand
- Develop the ability to recognize missing and incorrect notes easily
- Learn how to conduct various and distinctive musical features: fermata, cuing, legato, ritardando and staccato



Jubilate Junior youth ringers enthusiastically jumped at the opportunity offered by the Guild's Music Lending Librarian Debi Sproule, to provide a review on a piece of music found in OGEHR's collection. We chose a super fun piece that interestingly, as well as coincidentally, resembles and captures the spirit and energy of our ringing! If you ever directed a youth handbell choir, you may know ringing "until the walls come tumbling down" would be considered as an extremely cool rehearsal!

Joshua Fit the Battle of Jericho, is an enjoyable piece. Its big in sound with chunky chords and accidentals, is irresistible in rhythms, has options for ringing it straight or swung, and it includes a variety of techniques: mallets, marts, mart lifts, shakes, ring touch, making it an exciting experience and entertaining to play! It is Jubilate Junior approved, comes highly recommended and scores high on the fun factor!


