It's time to renew your OGEHR membership, and this year we are delighted to announce that you can register online on our website! Thank you all for your patience while we worked out the bugs in the process. If you had already started your process and were paying by PayPal, unfortunately you need to go back and start again because the payment was **not** processed.

Some tips to make your experience as easy as possible:

Form one is for the director and the organization. <u>Every choir must fill this form out first</u> so that affiliate members can then go online and complete their individual forms.

Form two is for affiliate members, which means you belong to a choir that is a member of OGEHR

Form three is for people who are not members of a choir but want to be members of OGEHR

Payment (Check out)

Should you wish to pay by PayPal then proceed as normal. Our PayPal gateway will allow you to pay with your credit card even if you don't have a PayPal account. Note that if you do have a PayPal account but don't wish to use it, you will need to open the OGEHR site in a private browsing (or "incognito") tab in your browser and complete registration there. Otherwise PayPal will send you to your PayPal log-in page during payment. Should you wish to pay by cheque you may fill out the information and put the cheque in the mail to:

In this year we will also continue to permit members who do not wish to pay online to send their cheques through the mail. Note that whether you choose to pay by cheque or by credit card, your membership process is not complete until payment has cleared and you receive a confirmation email.

Mary Romaniuk and Paula Niewstratten stepped in on short notice as additional ringers. Mary Lou Fallis added her resounding presence, performing during the Carols by Candlelight Service during the Festive Holiday Season.

As you all know, the setting up and putting away for weekly practice develops muscles and community, requiring all hands and strong backs to pull together. The building management staff of Trinity St. Paul's UC was extremely helpful in addressing the Bell Choir's needs: providing financial imperatives, booking times, setting up and taking down tables, trouble-shooting for performance times - and generally being good natured about adding another responsibility onto an already busy time.

Musically, the Bell Choir has been an appreciated addition. Performances were given during the Carols by Candlelight Evening Service, Easter Service, following through with the Pentecost theme heading into June. The aim to increase participation in the Sunday Service, by request of the Music Director and Minister, has become an understanding of intent. This approach opens

Music Lending Library tips for use of borrowed music

- 1. It is the responsibility of the person borrowing the music to ensure it is returned to the Library in good condition.
- 2. Marking the music with a light pencil is okay but do erase any markings when you are finished.
- 3. Please do not separate the pages.
- 4. Please do not add scotch tape anywhere on the music.
- 5. A maximum of 4 titles can be borrowed for up to one year.
- 6. It may be that there are not enough copies of some pieces for each ringer to have their own, so sharing is often necessary. It is against copyright law to photocopy originals.

National Seminar, 2018

This summer, I was one of about a dozen Canadians attending The National Handbell Seminar in Grand Rapids, Michigan from July 17th to 21st. This is the foremost American handbell festival and is held annually. The venue changes each year, moving around to different cities in different parts of the U.S. My first experience with National was 2 years ago in Rochester. Next year it is going to be held in St. Louis, Missouri.

National Seminar focuses on offering topnotch workshops from a large and varied selection of options and presenting concerts by advanced handbell groups. There are different levels of ringing tracks you can participate in if you want to do some group ringing, but there is no massed ringing experience like we have with the OGEHR Festivals.

The quartet I ring with, Anne Menzie, Kim Taylor, Pam Stuart and myself, decided to go together and do the quartet ringing track. I also signed up for Handbell Director's Boot Camp which was a track of 5 workshops packed full of valuable and interesting information. Along with these I took a number of single workshops to fill out my schedule.

An exciting part of attending Nationals, for me, is the opportunity to put a face to some of the big names in the handbell world. People like the Founding Director of Kalamazoo Ringers, Janet Van Valey who directed her last concert with the group at National. Karen Buckwalter gave a workshop on composing, Michael Sharik did one on Fifty Shades of Damping, Michael Joy, Dannie Lyons (of 8 in hand fame), David Weck, Michael Glasgow (who did a handbell stand-up comedy routine), Emily Li, our very own Debbie Fingas, all gave workshops, as well as many others!

You can totally immerse yourself in the handbell culture from early morning until well into the evening or you can pick and choose workshops to allow free time to do other things in the city you are visiting.

And have I mentioned the handbell shopping opportunities!! Jeffers, Malmark, Schulmerich, Witte, publishers, bells, chimes, cases, music, accessories, etc., etc. A handbell ringer's dream! And everything is connected, the hotel and convention centre house everything.
